

Working group Knowledge Translation Workshop Cork 17-18 April

Background

The burden-eu COST Action started in 2019 and focusses on the exchange of knowledge on methodologies, data handling and the link with policy makers regarding Burden of Disease approaches. It addresses challenges by 1) stimulating interaction between existing efforts, 2) supporting technical capacity building at country level, 3) providing a platform to support methodological advances, and 4) addressing the need for an actionable understanding of the process underlying knowledge translation. One of the 5 work groups in this cost action is Knowledge Translation. This working group has the objective to 1) Reach out to international activities in the field of knowledge translation, 2) Compile good practices in knowledge translation, 3) Develop a knowledge translation roadmap.

The meeting objectives and expected outputs

The 2-day workshop in Cork focusses on the exchange of good practices and experienced obstacles in knowledge translation in relation to burden of disease (BoD). There will be a large variety of country representatives, some of them doing or starting their own National BoB study, others doing a study in close collaboration with the Global Burden of Disease/IHME, and some of them in an earlier stage of BoD with analysis of epidemiological data. There will also be interaction with Irish policy makers to broaden the perspective of researchers doing the BoD. One of expected outcomes of this meeting is that we work on objective 3: a more practical KT-roadmap for BoD, with a sound scientific KT-basis and the inclusion of current practices and experiences with BoD studies.
